

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In 2007 Ireland had 4 whiskey distilleries, to date it has 25. Demand is high as the quality and variety are exceptional. The giants of Irish whiskey are global powerhouses, but the newcomers are holding their own offering connoisseurs something new to enjoy.

Similarly, new breeds of gin distillers are experimenting and innovating to offer more choice than ever before. There are now 20 gin distilleries and 50 brands to choose from. Distillers are also branching out into Poitín once only made illicitly.

The Irish craft beer and cider sectors have exploded too. 70 plus breweries account for 4% of the Irish beer market. Consumer demand is driving expansion as breweries continue to brew the flavour back into beer. Ireland's 18 craft cideries are offering plenty of choice by creating new ciders with complexity and character made from freshly pressed apples grown on their doorsteps.
